d. **Park District Hotel/Motel Grant Requests**

Background Of Subject Matter These events attract many people outside of our community. If approved, the Village will pay up to \$2,500 to reimburse no more than 50% of expenditures. The grant for Concerts in the Park will help secure more expensive bands to draw a larger attendance.

Additional Background The grant for Holly Days will allow for larger light displays, which will help draw even more people from out of town into our community. The Progressive Village Performance Network (PVPN) will use the funds to help in their performance of footloose.

e. **408-414 N Cass - 2nd Request For Extension Of Approvals**

Background Of Subject Matter The Village Board approved ordinances in June 2014 for a new townhome development on N Cass. Following approval, the developer worked with the Planning Engineer regarding stormwater concerns. Village Board granted a 10 month variance extension last fall.

Additional Background The extension was approved until April of 2016, when construction was supposed to occur or the variances would lapse. The developer is requesting a 2nd extension through August 2016 in order to submit for permits and begin work.



SUBJ: March 2016 Financial Report

Based on our auditor's recommendation, we are including monthly financial reports as part of our consent agenda, so it is formally accepted by the Village Board. I have attached the monthly financial report for the prior month, and wanted to point out a few items of interest as you review the report.

In summary, we are in good financial shape, and are tracking about where we would expect to be at this point in the fiscal year.

At the end of March, we are 11 months through the fiscal year, so in our General Fund revenues and expenditures should be tracking about 92% of the budget.

As you can see from the top line, revenues in the general fund are currently at 86% of budget. As we have discussed previously, there are several sources of revenue including Sales and Income Tax which are paid in arrears. On the other hand, we typically receive most of our annual property tax revenue by September. Additionally, some of our revenues are transfers or passthroughs that have not yet been booked. The last line on the report adjusts for all of these factors, and you can see that we are tracking at 97% of our fiscal year operating budgeted revenues, which is about where we would expect to be at this point in the year.

Our general fund expenditures total 97% of the budget, which is over our expected percentage, due to a transfer of about \$3.5 million to true up our General and Excess fund balances. At the last line you can see that after adjusting for this transfer, and for passthroughs, we are only at 80% of our budget. You will see that most departments are under 90%, with the exception of the General & Administration, due to the large true-up transfer.

Our bond funds are between 88% of 100% expended because of our work and land purchases to date. The IMRF fund has exceeded the budget because we have paid off the Early Retirement Incentive costs to avoid interest. The MFT Fund (61) has now begun receiving revenue as the state began disbursing these funds.

In the Treasurer's report you will notice that we have about \$2.1 million less than we had last year at this same time, because we are spending bond funds. As you can see from the chart, excluding the bonds, we are about \$1.6 million over where we were last year. Our general fund is at 600,000 less than last year, but when this is combined with our Excess General Fund Balance, we are up about \$1.8 million. Our Capital Projects, MFT, and Bond funds are down from last year because of planned purchases, and our IMRF balance is less than last year due to the ERI payment.

The Westmont Park District is requesting a Hotel/Motel grant for the Concerts in the Park.

The Concerts in the Park event has been a fundamental part of Westmont since the formation of this event 15 years ago. Every summer we offer a variety of different performances ranging from classical music to the golden oldies. This year we are looking to offer 4 different concerts at Veterans Park.

We are requesting the maximum amount allowed under the grant program, which we were informed would be \$2,500. The price of entertainment has gone up dramatically since the inception of this program. ORDINANCE NO. 14-103
**AN ORDINANCE APPROVING VARIANCES FOR A FRONT YARD SETBACK AND
FOR A DENSITY REDUCTION FOR PROPERTY LOCATED AT 408-412 N. CASS
AVENUE, WESTMONT**

WHEREAS, the Village of Westmont is a municipal corporation duly organized and operating pursuant to the laws of the State of Illinois; and

WHEREAS, Cass Avenue Dream Homes, LLC (“Applicant”) is the prospective owner of real property located at 408-412 N. Cass Avenue, Westmont, Illinois (the “Subject Property”), which is legally described in Exhibit “A” attached hereto; and

WHEREAS, Applicant proposes to construct four (4) townhome buildings for a total of twenty-two units upon the Subject Property, which is zoned R-4 General Residence District; and

WHEREAS, Applicant seeks a variance for density to allow this proposed development upon a minimum lot area of 83,700 square feet rather than the required minimum 127,800 square feet so that four (4) townhome buildings with approximately eight (8) three-bedroom units and fourteen (14); and two-bedroom units may be constructed; and

WHEREAS, Applicant also seek a variance for a front yard setback for the purpose of constructing a six (6) unit townhome building within the required 30’ front yard setback;

WHEREAS, Applicant is proposing a 15’ front yard setback on Cass Avenue; and

WHEREAS, the Westmont Planning & Zoning Commission conducted a public hearing after due notice and voted to recommend these variances pursuant to its written findings of fact; and

WHEREAS, the Village of Westmont Board of Trustees adopts said findings of fact and desires to grant these variances, specifically finding these variances to be compatible with surrounding recent development, with no adverse impact on surrounding properties.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Board of Trustees of the Village of Westmont, DuPage County, Illinois, as follows:

Section 1: Applicant’s request for a variance to allow a reduction in density to 83,700 square feet in lieu of 127,800 square feet on the Subject Property is hereby approved. This approval is subject to the following special condition, which is imposed to limit any adverse effects on the owner-occupiers of the Subject Property and on surrounding property owners, and is imposed due to concerns over the density of this project and unique impacts imposed by such density, and is imposed with the agreement and consent of the Applicant:

- A. No more than 4 townhouse units out of the 22 total townhouse units may be rented at any one time. The Applicant-Developer shall impose this rental restriction as part of a Declaration of Covenants, Conditions

and Restrictions recorded against title to the Subject Property, or such other similar document recorded against title to the Subject Property, and this special condition may not subsequently be removed by the owners of the Subject Property without the consent and approval of the Westmont Board of Trustees.

Section 2: Applicant's request for a variance to allow a reduction of the required front yard setback to 15' feet from the required 30' is hereby approved.

Section 3: All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of the conflict.

Section 4: This ordinance shall be in full force and effect after its passage, approval and publication as provided by law.



**AN ORDINANCE APPROVING AN EXTENSION OF VARIANCE APPROVALS
FOR CASS AVENUE DREAM HOMES, LLC FOR 408-414 N. CASS AVENUE**

WHEREAS, the Village of Westmont is a municipal corporation duly organized and operating pursuant to the laws of the State of Illinois; and

WHEREAS, Cass Avenue Dream Homes, LLC (“Applicant”) is the owner of real property located at 408-414 North Cass Avenue, Westmont, Illinois (the “Subject Property”), which is zoned R-4 General Residence District; and

WHEREAS, the Applicant received various development approvals from the Village of Westmont on June 12, 2014, including the approval of certain variances, to allow for the development of four (4) townhouse buildings upon the Subject Property; and

WHEREAS, variances granted by the Village are valid for a period of twelve (12) months, and expire if construction is not commenced within said twelve (12) month time frame; and

Section 3: All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of the conflict.

Section 4: This ordinance shall be in full force and effect after its passage, approval and publication as provided by law.


